Ways to Encourage Practicing

Here are some ways to encourage practicing, drawn from a variety of sources, some for kids, some for all ages:

—a colorful practice chart can make it fun and rewarding to see your accomplishments, and makes it matter that you practiced that day. It can be as simple as a check mark, or could be a chance to grade yourself on how you did (sometimes this gives permission to play something badly but to still get credit for doing it), and can be a place to remind yourself what tasks you'd like to get to.

—an audience can be inspiring, whether friends, family members, a cat or dog that doesn't leave the room (mine sometimes insists on singing along!), or for kids, an audience of stuffed animals.

—be the teacher and teach a friend, parent, or sibling how to do a simple skill or to sing or play part of a song you're working on

—plan rewards, like a favorite snack, or a toy or gift, after a certain amount of practicing has been done, based on filling out a practice chart, or some other measure.

—replace the word "practice" with "play" if the word "Practice" comes to mean merely homework. My motto for students is: "The more you play, the better you get. The more you play correctly, the faster you get better."

—value quality over quantity. Ten minutes of immersion in great practicing is worth 60 minutes spent watching the clock.
